### Situational Awareness

- The State of Michigan announced that 1,121 new individuals have tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 24 hours. This total is the highest single-day report since May 14.
- Beaumont Hospital Farmington Hills is reinstating a temporary no-visitor policy. The new policy states that patients with positive or pending tests for COVID-19 will not be allowed visitors except in extreme circumstances, including end-of-life situations.
- The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has rejected the request of Henry Ford Health System to continue to use hydroxychloroquine as a treatment for COVID-19. The FDA had previously ended the emergency use authorization that allowed hospitals to treat COVID-19 patients with the drug.
- Confirmed cases of COVID-19 have doubled in the Upper Peninsula over the last four weeks. Health officials say that tourism and interactions with residents of Wisconsin, which has relaxed some coronavirus prevention measures, may be to blame for the rise in this part of the State.
- The combined total of probable and confirmed COVID-19 cases in the State of Michigan over the entirety of the pandemic is now 99,856, including 6,555 deaths associated with the coronavirus.

### Actions Taken

- The City of Livonia receives a donation of 1,000 KN-95 masks from Alpha USA, a Livonia-based business. They will be distributed as needed as part of Together Livonia Cares, the City's initiative to support long-term care facilities in Livonia.
- In compliance with state rules limiting attendance at outdoor public gatherings, the Music from the Heart summer concert series has been postponed.
- The Wilson Barn Market is held on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Visitors are required to wear a mask or face covering.
- Registration for fall programs through Livonia Parks & Recreation is now open for all Livonia residents. Those interested in signing up can call (734) 466-2900 or visit the program catalogue [online](#). Also please note that 51 tickets remain for the next drive-in movie, *Hidden Figures*, hosted at the Kirksey Recreation Center.
